






John 5:1-15, The Healing at the Pool After seeing the way Jesus died and rose again, our time travelers want to see what Jesus did leading up to the cross. It turns out Jesus traveled the countryside telling people about the kingdom of God. Our travelers join Jesus as 1e enters Bethesda and meets a crippled man who is hoping in superstition to make him better. But he soon learns, that we should place all our hope in Jesus, who truly has the power to heal.


